



East India Marine Hall

This grand banquet hall was erected in 1824 for meetings of the East India Marine Society—entrepreneurs who sailed beyond Cape Horn and the Cape of Good Hope. Distinguished by its many arched, floor-to-ceiling windows, polished wood floors and artwork, the hall has been host to a vast array of illustrious dignitaries beginning with John Quincy Adams, who participated in the building’s dedication ceremonies. Additional galleries are available for rental if supplemental space is desired. East India Marine Hall is available for evening events only.
